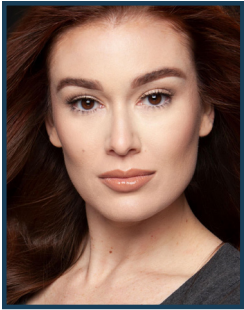

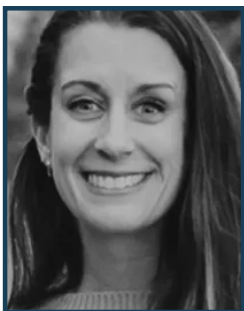
HANNAH BOHN

For over 30 years, she has trained in multiple styles of dance including classical ballet, pointe, jazz, lyrical, contemporary and more. Her career as a dancer includes instruction from various accomplished professionals, most notably from programs such as the American Ballet Theatre and Joffrey Ballet. Throughout her performing career, she has been featured in productions including lead roles such as the Sugar Plum Fairy in the Nutcracker Ballet, and the lead in the ballet production of Cinderella.

In 2011, Hannah served as Miss Illinois for the Miss America Organization. At the Miss Illinois Pageant, she was a double preliminary winner in both talent and lifestyle/swimsuit, as well as received the overall highest talent scholarship award. She represented Illinois in the 2012 Miss America Pageant, where she placed as a Top Ten Finalist and got to perform her talent of Ballet en Pointe Live on ABC. Hannah was involved with the Miss Illinois Production team for 8 years as the Head Choreographer for both the Teen and Miss divisions. For the past 5 years, Hannah has served as both a panel and head state judge with the Miss America Organization for: California, Utah, Indiana, Nebraska, Alabama, Iowa and North Carolina. Many of those state title holders finished in the Top 15 and Top 10 at each Miss America Pageant.

In Hannah's professional career, she traveled as a Product Specialist and Presenter on the National Auto Show Circuit for 8 years and was a published Lifestyle and Fitness Model, working for clients like Adidas. Hannah is currently an Emcee and Dance Judge for several touring dance competition companies. She has been a high school dance team coach/choreographer and judge in the state of Illinois for a total of 13 years and counting. In this circuit, she has had several Sectional Championship and State Final placing teams. At the studio level, her award-winning choreography has earned her recognition at the regional, state and national levels. In 2017, Hannah founded Reverence Dance Company, where she and her staff have trained and choreographed for nearly 100 select high school aged dancers across the state. Hannah is also entering her third year as a Liaison for Dance Team Union, where she works closely with dance team coaches in 5 states across the country.

In her free time, Hannah enjoys traveling, seeing Broadway musicals, discovering new vegan recipes, and spending time with her husband Zach, 15 month year old daughter Riley, and their two miniature dachshunds, Nori and Bernie! MORGAN HANENBERGER

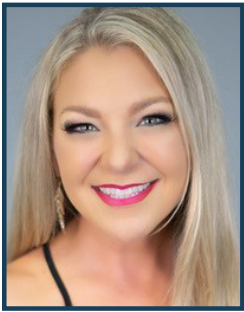

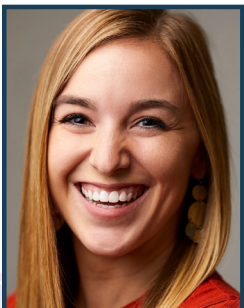


LINDSEY LARSON

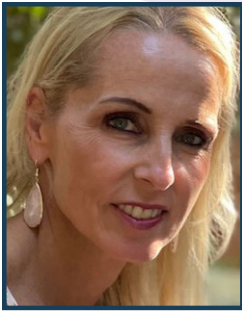

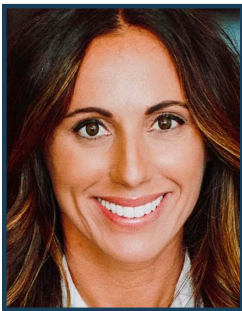


STEPHANIE SIBENALLER

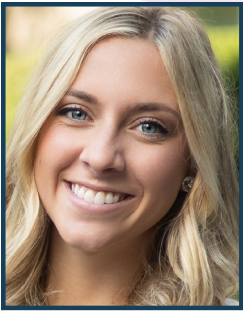


CASSIDY VERMEER

SAM HOUSTON BROWN

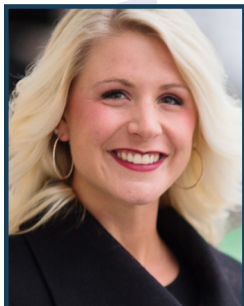

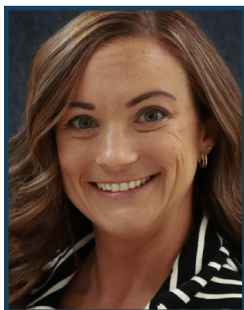


HOLLY REIMER

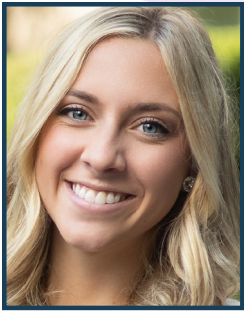


CASSIDY VERMEER
